NARRATIVE

On 10/31/2015 at 2213 hours, Ofc. Rynning and I arrived at 2390 SW 106th Terrace in response to a reported domestic disturbance where an unknown type firearm had been discharged. Upon arrival, Ofc. Rynning and I began to walk towards the residence and observed an Hispanic female, later identified as Christina Barnea (victim) walking towards us.

Barnea made the statement while walking towards Ofc. Rynning and I that, "those guns aren't needed." We asked her initially what had happened and why she had called police. She advised that she and her boyfriend, later identified as Albertin Chapman had an argument. She initially advised that he had pushed her and the argument had been broken up by family members. Chapman walked outside the residence and C. Barnea advised she heard "shotgun" blasts but did not know where they were coming from. She then ran to the south side of the residence to the north of the incident location and had hid behind bushes until she made contact with police. She advised her infant child was also still inside the residence with Chapman.

Ofc. Rynning, Ofc. Ray, Ofc. Shannon, Ofc. Bart, Ofc. Rabelo and I then approached the residence and observed several persons leaving the residence. As the subjects walked out, there were given instructions to approach officers and were checked for any firearms or involvement in the incident. None of the subjects that left the residence were Chapman. A perimeter was then established on the residence and attempts were made to contact Chapman and have him exit the residence. Eventually, Chapman exited the front of the residence without incident.

Ofc. Honore made contact with C. Barnea who advised she wished to give a sworn recorded statement regarding the incident. Ofc. Honore then began to take the statement and Barnea stated she got into a verbal altercation with her child's father Alberto Chapman because she found something in his phone that she did not like. She went into the bathroom with his phone and he took the phone away from her while they were inside of the bathroom. After that, she followed him to the bar and told him that she wanted to talk to him inside of the movie theater. Both parties then walked to the movie theater and once inside, she said that he became aggravated and pushed her against the wall. That is when her brother, later identified as Dany Barnea came in the theater and separated them. After they were separated, C. Barnea ran outside because she was scared for her and her daughter. She ran to her neighbor's residence and hid outside in the bushes. While she was hiding, she heard one gun shot, but she does not know who it came from. C. Barnea signed an affidavit of complaint advising she did not wish to prosecute.

Ofc. Urbaez spoke with Dany Barnea regarding the incident. D. Barnea advised Ofc. Urbaez his sister, C. Barnea, was having a gathering at the above listed residence with family and friends. During the gathering, Barnea overheard his sister and Chapman arguing in the front living room area. Barnea went to defend his sister and attempted to stop the argument. While Barnea was trying to stop the argument, Barnea's mother also tried to intervene. Barnea stated that he was concerned for his mother, so he escorted her away from the victim and Chapman. Barnea stayed with his mother in a separate room while the argument continued in the front living room area. Barnea did not see any type of physical altercation other than a verbal argument between Chapman and C. Barnea. Barnea refused to give a sworn

recorded statement.

Ofc. Haines then spoke with Yansy Fernandez, who is Chapman's employed driver. Fernandez advised Ofc. Haines he had observed the altercation between Albertin Chapman and the mother of his child, Christina Barnea. Fernandez stated he was standing at the entrance of the residence's theater room when he heard Albertin and Christina arguing inside the theater. Fernandez stated that Christina ran out of the room with Chapman's phone. She then returned to the theater room, charging at Chapman and tackled him. Fernandez said Christina's brother, D Barnea, then saw Chapman and Christina on the floor where Chapman was pushing Christina off of him. Christina's brother then jumped in to defend his sister. Once Christina's brother got involved, Fernandez said the parties went their separate ways and the altercation ended. Fernandez refused to provide a sworn tape recorded statement.

Ofc. Rivas and Ofc. Brito then made contact with Chapman due to Chapman speaking Spanish. Chapman advised that earlier today, while having a party with friends and family at his house his girlfriend started fighting with him over his cell phone. He advised that he used his index and middle finger he poked his girlfriend on the left shoulder and told her not to talk to him like that. He said that she fell to the floor and started yelling. Her brother came in and pushed Chapman to the ground. Friends and family separated the two so that they would not fight. Chapman said he got up and exited the residence. He wanted to drive away but friends would not let him. He got in the passenger seat of his white 2015 Land Rover bearing Fl tag# DYK-W07 and his friend got in the driver's seat. He then punched the passenger side window with his left fist from inside the vehicle, creating a laceration to his left pinky knuckle. He then retrieved his pistol from the glove compartment, exited his vehicle and went locked himself in the garage alone. He then shot several shots inside the garage and threw his pistol away inside the garage. His friends then took him to his room and locked themselves in it. When Police arrived they had everyone exit the residence. Chapman refused to give a sworn recorded statement or sign an affidavit of complaint. Chapman did sign a consent to search for his exterior garage.

I then spoke to C. Barnea regarding the incident. She advised that Chapman had pushed her against the wall near the movie theater room inside the residence. She then advised she had then exited the room to the bathroom with Chapman's cell phone. I asked her about the witness account of her running towards Chapman and "tackling" him to the ground. She advised she did not know anything about that. She then advised that she was on the ground with Chapman and had then run out of the theater room. I asked her how she had fallen to the ground and she could not advise. She then said that he had pushed her up against the wall and she then fell to the floor. She then advised that Chapman had "choked" her by placing his hands around her neck, but did not prevent her from breathing at any time. I asked her where he grabbed her and she pointed to her neck, but there were no injuries or even redness anywhere on her neck or chest. She then advised she did not want to have any further involvement with the incident and wished to gather her belongings and leave. She was eventually allowed to get her belongings and leave the residence. She was advised that if she wished to get the rest of her belongings at a later time, she could ask for Davie Police officers to stand by while she does so. She left the residence on her own accord at the time of this incident. Photographs of her neck and chest were later placed into Davie Police property control.

I then spoke to Fernandez and asked him to retell what he had observed during the incident. Fernandez then advised that he was not going to make any other statements unless he feels that police officers are not handling the incident to his satisfaction.

It was later determined that after CST. Shaw was unable to locate a firearm inside the garage; Fernandez had removed the firearm from the garage and placed it inside Chapman's white 2015 Cadillac Escalade. Fernandez advised he had moved the firearm and placed it inside the vehicle to prevent anyone finding the firearm and hurting themselves. Fernandez was advised that he had removed evidence from the crime scene. Fernandez was further advised that he had hindered the investigation by doing so. He advised he understood and it was not his intent to hinder the investigation.

Due to several inconsistencies in the victim's statements, as well as the statement from C. Barnea changing several times during the investigation, this case will be forwarded to the State Attorney's Office for review. CST. Shaw arrived during the investigation and processed the scene.

On 10-30-15 Officer Byrne responded to a domestic disturbance where a firearm was discharged. Further investigation revealed that Albertin Aroldis Chapman was hosting a party at his residence for family and friends. During the party he was involved in a physical altercation with his girlfriend, Cristina Barnea, over information she obtained from his cell phone. Conflicting stories were given by Mr. Chapman and Ms. Barnea along with the witnesses who were family members. There were also no visible signs of injury on Mr. Chapman or Ms. Barnea. After the altercation, Mr. Chapman left the residence and entered a friend's vehicle that was parked next to his garage. While inside the vehicle, Mr. Chapman punched the passenger side window with his left hand then reached inside the glove box and removed a hand gun. Mr. Chapman then exited the vehicle and entered his garage, which at the time of the incident was unoccupied. While inside the garage, Mr. Chapman fired seven rounds into a concrete wall and fired one round that exited the garage through a window, the round was believed to have traveled into a large area of vacant land. During the shooting there were no guests present inside or outside of the garage that could have been injured. CST Shaw responded for crime scene investigations and recovered (8) shell casing inside the garage. The gun was turned in by Mr. Chapman's employee, Yensy Fernandez, who removed the gun from the garage and held it for safe keeping until the police arrived and conducted the investigation. No arrest was made during the investigation due to conflicting stories and a lack of cooperation from all parties involved. Ms. Barnea collected some belongings and left the residence.

On 11-03-15 I made contact with Ms. Barnea's brother, Dany Barnea, who would not provide me with a statement concerning the incident. I then asked him to give me Ms. Barnea's phone number, but he refused to do so. I then provided him with my phone number and asked that he give the number to his sister so that she could call me. Mr. Barnea advised that he would give her my number but stated that she would probably not call.

On 11-03-15 I made contact with ASA Marcie Zaccor and discussed the incident. I was advised that due to conflicting stories, no cooperating witnesses, and no physical injuries, there is insufficient evidence to charge Mr. Chapman with simple battery. I was also told that since Mr. Chapman fired a gun inside of a closed and unoccupied garage there is also insufficient evidence to charge him with a gun violation.

Due to conflicting stories, lack of cooperation by the victim and witnesses, no physical injuries, and the fact that Mr. Chapman fired his gun in a closed garage with no one present, there is insufficient evidence to charge him with a crime.

This case is inactive/open.
